I've always found the relationships that we as humans have fascinating. The way we communicate by saying so much or so little. Language isn't just verbal, it's physical. The way we talk and the way we move defines our behaviour and everybody behaves differently because we all want different things. Essentially what we want is reflected in our behaviour. But what fascinates me is how we behave when we feel threatened. How our fear and paranoia

corrode the mind. When our goals, safety and well being are threatened our strategies change. Thierry Steimer (PhD in clinical psychopharmacology) states that 'emotions are not just "feelings" or mental states, but are accompanied by physiological and behavioural changes that are an integral part of them', (Steimer, 2002) When our behaviour changes we either instantly become a different person or with time we become a different person. Fear and paranoia induced by threat change us instantly as we react immediately. Whereas something with that is a slow and more subtle threat can change us over time.

Something I believe we as human beings are blind to is the threat of technology. The rapid evolution of modern day technology has defined and revolutionised our existence. 'As the philosopher Hannah Arendt put it in 1958, we have in recent centuries developed a science "that considers the nature of the Earth from the viewpoint of the Universe". Yet in doing so we have paradoxically trained ourselves to ignore the most important lesson of all: our co-evolution with technology.' (Chatfield, 2019) This was a statement from Tom Chatfield in an article for *BBC Future*. I believe that technology is an incredibly visible yet invisible threat to our species. In light of this, I want to create a film that makes a comment on where the future of entertainment is heading (in regards to where the development of modern day technology is leading us). I believe that our core characteristic as human beings lies in our ability to empathise with one another. To feel a love and a compassion towards one another. And so, *The Audition*, aims to lend a perspective into the possible future: Will the mass consumption of entertainment see the line between fiction and reality become nothing but a blur. If our need for more overpowers our ability to empathise then what are we as humans becoming?
